When you study or read different books, you might see amounts of money written a few different ways. Here are a few ways to write some of the amounts of dollars and cents:

Dollars

One dollar



\$1.00

Five dollars



\$5.00

Ten dollars



\$10.00

Twenty dollars



\$20.00

Cents



One cent \$0.01 1¢



Five cents \$0.05 5¢



Ten cents \$0.10 10¢



Twenty-five cents \$0.25 25¢

It's the Same Amount!

If you use money often enough, you'll find out that you can use different coins or bills to get the same amount of money. Here are some ways to do this:





(Five pennies = One nickel)





(Two nickels = One dime)





(Five nickels = One quarter)




(Two dimes and One nickel = One quarter)





(Five pennies = One nickel)

It's the Same Amount! (Continued)





(100 pennies = One dollar)





(Four quarters = One dollar)





(Five 1-dollar bills = One 5-dollar bill)





(Two 5-dollar bills = One 10-dollar bill)





(Two 10-dollar bills = One 20-dollar bill)





(Two 5-dollar bills and one 10-dollar bill)
